Community Support Program

Free clothing, hygiene items, household goods, and shelf-stable food.

After School, summer camp, and Cricut entrepreneurship classes.

Senior Services

Meals, activities, and social work support through Council on Aging.

Housing & Stability

Affordable housing and support for families transitioning from homelessness.

Furnishing Futures

Furniture and household essentials for families establishing stable housing.

Impact Story

A family arrived after leaving a homeless shelter with little more than the clothes they were wearing. Through NFCC, they received weekly groceries, clothing, furniture, household essentials, and support from our social worker. Together, we connected the family with housing resources, benefits, and community services. What began as a request for food became a fresh start, helping the family build stability, dignity, and hope for the future.
